	Manybooks	ManyBooks has more than 50,000 free online books available, and offers neatly categorized sections of texts in different genres. The site hosts a varied collection of books formatted for readers in formats such as EPUB, MOBI, PDF, TXT, etc. manybooks.net
	LibriVox	LibriVox offers a large selection of free audio books to download. All of LibriVox audiobooks are in the public domain (in the USA) and have been recorded by volunteers to contribute to the project. librivox.org
	Project Gutenberg	Project Gutenberg is a volunteer effort to digitize and archive cultural works, to "encourage the creation and distribution of eBooks". The design looks like it's from the mid-90s, but functions well enough, and has multiple reader formats. gutenberg.org
	Free-eBooks	This website features neatly organized categories and filters to find ebooks in various formats. The interface is quite clean and clear, and while there's not as many ebooks as other platforms, the quality seems to be overall better than most. free-ebooks.net
	Hathitrust	HathiTrust Digital Library is a large-scale collaborative repository of digital content from research libraries including content digitized via Google Books and the Internet Archive digitization initiatives, as well as content digitized locally by libraries. hathitrust.org

	Duolingo	Gamified interactive language learning via a website and mobile app. Thoughtfully and beautifully designed, and offers comprehensive coverage for many languages. Over 300 million active users. duolingo.com
	Memrise	Memrise is a language learning app with gamified elements, and a clean and intuitive interface. Founded in 2010, it has grown to help more than 40 million people in 195 countries learn new languages. memrise.com
	Busuu	Busuu is a very nicely designed, AI-powered language learning platform on web, iOS and Android which allows users to interact with native speakers from around the world. busuu.com
	Google Translate	Google Translate uses a mixture of traditional translation with powerful AI algorithms. A lesser-known feature is the app's ability to translate live text using your phone's camera, such that you are able to read a foreign menu, for example. translate.google.com
	Forvo	Forvo is the largest online reference for pronunciations with a database of nearly 6 million words pronounced in over 300 languages – all created and maintained by native speakers. forvo.com
	Hellotalk	HelloTalk connects you with native speakers to chat with for free. The app provides a good set of features to help facilitate learning, and is easy to use. hellotalk.com
